<p>The Arts: Dance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> to focus on the study and performance of multicultural dances more complex dances, including historical and cultural importance of the dances to explore improvisational and expressive movement and attend performance that incorporate multicultural dance 	<p>The Arts: Visual Arts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> to expand their talents and techniques from second grade and utilize varied media to recreate their impressions of scenes from their lives to do three-dimensional projects and view artworks by artists of many cultures and discuss the differences and commonalities in the works to explore the world around them through an artistic lens by developing a greater appreciation for nature and artists throughout time and across cultures to display their work and visit museums
